NOTICE OF CLOSING OF UNOPENED PART OF ROAD ALLOWANCE

TAKE NOTICE that the Municipal Council for the Township of Chisholm will hold a teleconference public meeting on the 28th day of September, 2021, at the hour of 6:00 p.m. from the Council Chambers, to consider, and if approved, will pass and enact at the meeting a proposed By-Law to close, stop up, and declare the lands to be surplus, and to sell to the adjoining land owner, the portion of the following unopened road allowance, namely:

ALL AND SINGULAR THAT certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situated, lying and being in the Township of Chisholm, in the District of Nipissing, being part of a road allowance between Lot 15 and Lot 16, Concession 16, in the said Township of Chisholm as shown on Plan 36R-14570 and designated thereon as Part 1.

The said plan of surveys for Part 1, Plan 36R-14570 may be examined at the office of the Clerk of the Township of Chisholm at the Municipal Office, 2847 Chiswick Line, Chisholm Township, Ontario, upon making arrangements in advance and in accordance with any COVID-19 protocols then in place.

AND TAKE NOTICE that, due to COVID-19 precautions, the public may only attend the said meeting via telephone, by telephoning 1-855-343-6177 and entering conference ID 5125690. Council will, at the said meeting, hear by telephone from any person, or from their counsel, solicitor or agent, who claims his/her land to be prejudicially affected by the said By-Law, and who applies to be heard at said meeting to the Municipal Council in advance of 3:00 p.m. on the scheduled date of the meeting.

Pumpkin Spice Latte Chocolate Chip Cookies

Ingredients: 2 sticks of butter 16 tablespoons,
1/2 cup pumpkin puree, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract,
1/4 cup brewed coffee cooled, 1 egg yolk, 1 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup granulated sugar, 1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour, 1 3/4 cups all purpose flour, 1 1/2 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 1/4 tsp salt, 2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips.



Instructions: In a large bowl microwave butter to be 3/4 melted, a little solid. Add pumpkin puree and vanilla extract and stir to combine, then stir in the coffee. Next add in the egg yolk and stir. Pour in the brown sugar and granulated sugar and stir until combined. Pour whole wheat flour, all purpose flour, pumpkin pie spice, baking soda and salt in and stir until all ingredients are combined. Using a wooden spoon, stir in chocolate chips.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Arrange oven racks to the top and bottom 1/3 of the oven. Line two baking sheets with silicone baking mats or parchment paper. Scoop dough into 1 1/2 tablespoon size balls (I use a cookie scoop) and place 2 inches apart on prepared cookie sheets. Bake cookies for 5 minutes, rotate pans and bake for another 6 minutes. Cookies should bake for 11-12 minutes or until slightly browning on edges. Then remove from oven and allow to cool for 5 minutes before transferring to a cooling rack. Enjoy!
