August 3rd, 17th, and 31st.

Please have your blue box at the curb by 7:00 a.m.

Get to know what materials are recyclable and keep them sorted! (more info at Chisholm.ca under Municipal Services)

Paper Products: newspaper, flyers, magazines, catalogues, telephone books, books (soft and hard cover), writing paper, envelopes, shredded paper.

Boxboard: cereal, detergent and tissue boxes, paper tubes, egg cartons, drink trays, and corrugated cardboard.

Cartons and Tetrapaks: milk & juice cartons, juice boxes

Containers: metal cans (beverage, food, empty dry paint cans)

Glass: bottles and jars (clear and coloured)

Plastic food & beverage containers: look on the bottom for #1-7 (jugs, tubs, bottles, jars, etc.)

Plastic film: grocery bags, milk bags, cracker & cereal bags, cheese wrappers, clean plastic wrap, etc.

Aluminum: cans, trays, foil, etc.

Styrofoam: clean meat trays, foam cups, packaging, etc.

- Make sure containers are clean and free of debris.
- Flatten/tie/stack your cardboard together, separate from all other paper products.
- Leave labels on containers.
- Take lids off bottles and put them in the garbage.

Composting Tips!

Don't:

- Do not compost fats, pet droppings, or animal products. They will attract pests to the pile and can spread disease.

Do:

- Newspaper or plain white paper from the computer is excellent for composting – just remember to shred it first to speed up the process.
- If adding ashes to your compost bin, do so sparingly. They are alkaline and affect the pH of the pile. In contrast, acidic materials include pine needles and oak leaves
- Worms love coffee grounds!

Notice of Complete Application & Public Meetings

(1) Zoning By-law Amendment – 1354 Memorial Park Drive – Tuesday, September 12, 2017 – 7:00 p.m.

Council will consider a Zoning By-law Amendment for the purpose of amending the Restricted Area Zoning By-law No. 2014-25, as amended, to lands located in Part Lot 2, Concession 13. The RU-5 Zone was a zone category originally established to permit a furniture manufacturing & retail business on Lot 2, Concession 13. However, a recent consent approval has allowed the workshop & lands utilized for the furniture business to be severed. As a result the larger retained parcel will be zoned back to the RU Zone & the RU-5 Zone will be amended so that the business may operate independently or in an accessory manner to a residential dwelling.

(2) Zoning By-law Amendment – Grahamvale Road – Tuesday, September 12, 2017 – 7:15 p.m.

Council will consider a Zoning By-law Amendment for the purpose of amending the Restricted Area Zoning By-law No. 2014-25, as amended, to lands located in a Rural Exception (RU-9) (H) Holding Zone. The purpose of the zone exception is to permit a dwelling with a non-compliant floor area. The purpose of the Holding Zone is to restrict new building construction or building additions until a private septic system has been installed & the structure is compliant with the Ontario Building Code to be used for habitable purposes.

Restore Your Shore Program 2017

If your home, cottage or farmland property boasts a streambank, lakefront, river or watercourse, you may be eligible for **free shoreline plants and planting assistance** as part of the North Bay-Mattawa Conservation Authority's Restore Your Shore Program.

Up to 30 property owners can have their shoreline planted this year with native trees, shrubs and plants to help improve the water quality of our lakes and streams. Planting of the shoreline will prevent erosion and run off, enhance fish habitat, and reduce the addition of phosphorus into our waterways which contributes to the growth of blue green-algae.

Civic Holiday (from Wikipedia)

Civic Holiday is the most widely used name for a public holiday celebrated in most of Canada on the first Monday in August, though it is only officially known by that term by the governments of Nunavut, the Northwest Territories, and Prince Edward Island. The Civic holiday is recognized as a statutory holiday in those three provinces and territories.

The holiday is known by a variety of names in other provinces and municipalities, including British Columbia Day in British Columbia, New Brunswick Day in New Brunswick, and Saskatchewan Day in Saskatchewan. The holiday is celebrated as Natal Day in Nova Scotia and Terry Fox Day in Manitoba. The day is not a statutory holiday in Nova Scotia and Manitoba.

The holiday was renamed Simcoe Day in Toronto, Ontario effective 1969 in honour of the first Lieutenant-Governor of Upper Canada. The Civic Holiday is also known by a number of local appellations in other cities in Ontario. When not given a local name, it is often referred to as 'Civic Holiday'.
