With Christmas Eve and New Years Eve both falling on a Saturday this year, the landfill will be open but <u>at reduced hours</u> as noted below:

Saturday, December 24 & 31, 2022: 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

#### Keep fire safety in mind as temperatures drop!

The Chisholm Township Fire Dept. is urging everyone to keep fire safety in mind as the temperatures turn colder. To stay warm and safe this winter:

- Have all fuel-burning appliances inspected annually by a registered fuel contractor. Go to COSafety.ca to find a contractor near you.
- Keep chimneys and intake/exhaust vents for furnaces and heating appliances free of debris, ice and snow to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide (CO) build-up from inefficient combustion.
- Burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves to prevent creosote build-up in chimneys.
- Allow ashes from your fireplace or woodstove to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing.
- Replace worn or damaged electrical wires and connections on vehicles and extension cords and use the proper gauge extension cord for vehicle block heaters.
- Consider using approved timers for vehicle block heaters rather than leaving heaters on all night.
- Ensure vehicles are not left running inside a garage or building.
- Ensure there is a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas of your home.
- Install CO alarms to alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.

The Fire Dept. reminds everyone that the Ontario Fire Code requires smoke alarms to be installed on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. Carbon monoxide alarms are required outside all sleeping areas if the home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage. For more information about smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, or fire safety, contact the Township Office and ask for Fire Chief, Ray Ford.

- Nickel cadmium



## Plan Ahead for Spring!



Please remember that the township has a Reduced Load Limit By-law to designate half load restrictions on roads (By-law 2019-16). In the spring, frost comes out of the ground and as this moisture comes out of the road bed, the road becomes softer and weaker. Heavy loads can cause the road to sink and break apart, which can lead to permanent damage. Most rural roadways are not built to withstand the pressures of heavy equipment, especially in the spring. The reduced loads can be in affect anytime between March 1 and May 31. If you are needing large deliveries, maybe try and have them delivered over the winter prior to March 1st.
