Time to Change your Clocks and the Batteries in all Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarms!

Clocks will spring forward one hour at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 10, 2024 and the Chisholm Township Fire Department urges you to install new batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide alarms when you change your clock. Smoke alarms provide the crucial early warning you need to survive a fire, but they'll only do that with working batteries. Check your alarms regularly, and install new batteries annually.

Ontario law requires working smoke alarms on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas. (For added protection, it is also a good idea to install smoke alarms inside bedrooms). If you have a fuel-burning appliance including a furnace or gas stove, fireplace, wood stove or an attached garage, you are also required to install a carbon monoxide alarm outside sleeping areas.

Keep your family safe from carbon monoxide.

- Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home.
- Test them **every month**.
