### NOTICE - 2021 SPRING LOAD RESTRICTIONS IN EFFECT AS OF MARCH 15, 2021 BY-LAW 2019-16

The Township enforces reduced load restrictions on trucks to protect the Township's roadways during spring thaw, when road damage is most likely to occur.

Reduced load limits are in effect where and when signs are posted depending on the road and weather conditions.



Disasters and emergencies can strike any time. But while 85% of Canadians agree it is a good idea to be prepared with an emergency kit, only 40% actually have one. Mark this National Emergency Preparedness Week (May 2-8) by putting together your own kit, and being ready for the next fire, flood or storm.

Your emergency kit should include everything you will need to fend for yourself or your family for 72 hours, including:

- \* Water two litres of water per person per day (include small bottles)
- \* Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (replace once a year)
- \* Manual can opener
- \* Wind-up or battery powered flashlight (and extra batteries)
- \* First aid kid
- \* Extra keys for your car and house
- \* Cash, travellers' cheques and change
- \* Important family documents such as ID, insurance and bank records
- \* A family or household emergency plan and contact information for family members, childcare, pet, kennels, medical and vet care, etc.

#### **BURN PERMITS 2021**

Burn permits are usually required within the Township from April 1st to October 31st, but due to COVID19, the permits will <u>not</u> be required for 2021, but you <u>must</u> however follow the rules regarding burn time. No fires between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.

Fire burning conditions/rules:

- Do not permit more than four cubic meters of material to be burned at any one time.
- 2. Do not ignite any fire between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. (including burn barrels).
- A minimum of one person must be in constant attendance of the fire. Never leave fire unattended.
- 4. The permittee must have enough fire fighting equipment on hand to control the fire at all times (ie. Shovels, pales, axes, hose).
- 5. Permit only valid for burning of grass and wood or by-products of wood.
- 6. No burning in winds greater than 15 km/h.
- 7. Incinerator fires must be burned in an enclosed device covered by screen mesh with openings less than 5 millimeters. The incinerator must be at least 5 meters from any forest, at least 2 meters from flammable material, and must be monitored by a responsible person until the fire is out.
