CHISHOLM FIRE DEPARTMENT

Chisholm's Fire Department reminds you to be prepared for winter power outages.

Despite the balmy temperatures last month, winter really is on its way. Before ice, wind, and snowstorms knock out the power and put the chill on your home, be ready by tuning up your generator and cleaning your wood stove's chimney. It is also a good time to ensure you have the following:

- A good supply of batteries and three day-supply of drinking water, along with battery-powered lamps and flashlights;
- A solar charger for your cell phone;
- Working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms;
- A battery-powered radio, and;
- Your neighbour's phone number. An extended outage is a good time to check on neighbours and offer help.

BEAT THE SILENT KILLER

Stay safe from carbon monoxide.

Ensure all fuel-burning appliances in your home are inspected annually.

Install and regularly test carbon monoxide alarms.

You must install a **carbon monoxide alarm** adjacent to all sleeping areas if your home has fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage.

Rechargeable and single-use batteries weighing 5 km or less each. No wet-cell, damaged or defective batteries accepted.



Update on Collection of Agriculture Plastic Wrap Pilot Project

The Township of Chisholm worked with OFA and NOFIA as part of a pilot project to collect agricultural plastic. Chisholm was the only municipality who participated in the pilot project. Council had agreed to purchase the press to hold and compact the plastic. Our goal was to keep the plastic out of the landfill. We are happy to announce that 12 plastic bales have been picked up and will be shipped to an Ontario business who will be recycling the plastic into a new product.

Thank you to all the farmers who participated. We will continue to collect bale wrap as long as there is an end user to process it.
