# CHISHOLM FIRE DEPARTMENT November is Carbon Monoxide Awareness Month

You can not see, smell, or taste it, but carbon monoxide (CO) is a toxic gas that is a threat in any home with wood, oil, propane or natural-fired gas appliances. It is even a potential problem in an attached garage where cars and trucks could be left idling.

Carbon monoxide is a by-product of combustion. It builds up in your home if your appliances are not running properly, or you have engine exhaust entering the home. Carbon monoxide's an additional hazard during extended winter power outages, when homeowners run generators or look for other ways to keep the chill off.

Protect yourself and your family with working CO alarms near all sleeping areas. Never leave a vehicle running in a garage. Never cook with barbecues or propane cookers in the home, and always use propane heaters inside a home or garage.

During a power outage, do not drag the camp stove inside and use it to cook supper – it is only designed for safe use outdoors. If you are using a generator during a power outage, do not run it inside the house or garage, even if the doors and windows are open. Instead, keep it about seven and a half metres (25 feet) from the home. Point the exhaust away from the house.

Common signs of carbon monoxide poisoning include headache, dizziness, nausea and confusion – often described as "flu-like" symptoms. If your CO alarms go off, get outside into the fresh air, and call 9-1-1.
